Make notes when listening for a sustained period and discuss how note taking varies depending on context and purpose.	Analyse and evaluate how speakers present points effectively through use of language and gesture Listen for language variation in formal and informal contexts Identify the ways spoken language varies according to differences in context and purpose of its use. Identify the main methods used by presenters to explain, persuade, amuse or argue a case, eg emotive language.

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
